Green solutions drive the economy but more can be done

Businesses are developing schemes to transition to a circular economy



Brussels, 29 September 2016 – The American Chamber of Commerce to the European Union (AmCham EU) supports businesses adopting higher resource efficiency measures in response to the rapid economic and demographic growth which has strained the world's limited resources. These green solutions drive the economy and maximise the use and value of raw materials, the actual products and associated waste. Companies know these measures make both environmental and business sense and have made great progress in adopting such schemes, but more can be achieved.

AmCham EU counts among its membership many companies who support the transition to a circular economy, which aims to make the most of resources at each stage of a product's life. It launched yesterday a publication entitled *The Circular Economy: 10 innovative business solutions and how to go further*.
